Bendigo 1960's

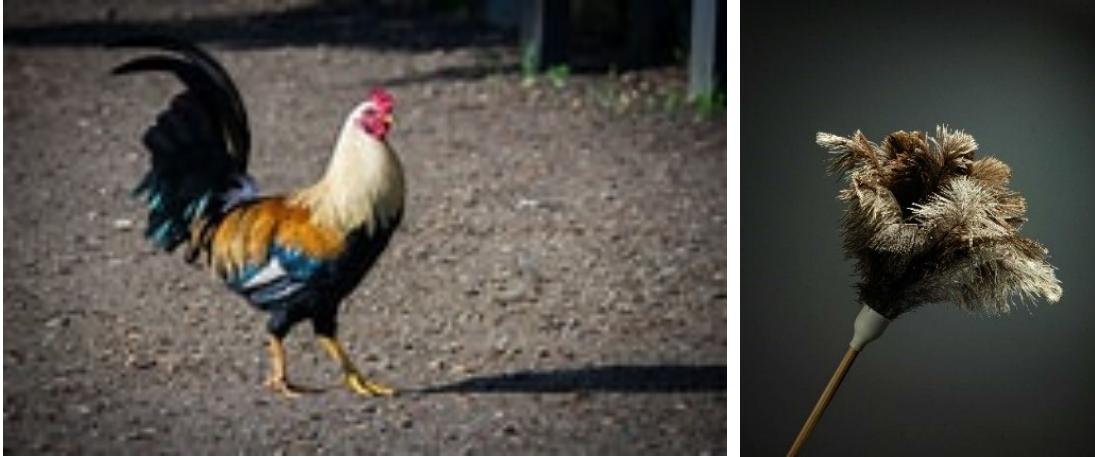
