

1931-1932 Warren Tredinnick

Warren Tredinnick served as President in 1931 – 1932 (this was his second term as he was the President in 1930-31).

On December 3, 1931, the District Governor came to the Club on his official visit to the weekly luncheon. In the evening. The D.G entertained members and partners with pictures taken on his visit to the Vienna Conference.

In April 1932, the District Conference in Geelong was attended by the World President of Rotary International, Sydney Pascal, which ensured it was an outstanding Conference for all those Rotarians that attended.

The Extension and International Committee, had a successful year with communications with Clubs in New Zealand, the Malayan States, Ceylon, India, England, Scotland, Canada and the U.S.A.

Despite the economic times were not favourable to forming new Clubs, preliminary discussions had begun with the formation of Clubs in Castlemaine, Echuca, Kyneton and Swan Hill. At this time, Swan Hill had made the most progress and a report was written and sent to the District Governor.

Entertainment became a real focus for the Club at this time. Its main purpose was to welcome new members and increase fellowship among members of the Club. Despite the past restrictions to only a very limited number of meetings women could attend, the Club decided to have a monthly Ladies Night.

This proved so successful that a Ladies Committee was eventually formed which focused on how to increase fellowship within the Club.
